
The First Presbyterian Church Of Stirling Presents

Violinist Gabriel Schaff and Anna Keiserman, Pianist Sunday, January 12 @ 2 DM





Russian-born and New York-based pianist Anna Keiserman is known for her creative programming, expressive freedom and singular vision. As a soloist Anna has performed concerti by Rachmaninoff, Haydn, Beethoven and Arensky with the Volgograd Symphony Orchestra, and also toured through Italy and Russia. Among Dr. Keiserman's awards are top prizes in two international piano competitions in Russia: one based in Volgograd, the other in Saratov. Recently Anna was awarded 3rd place in the "American Prize in Piano Performance" competition.

Mr. Schaff has been affiliated with, and a tenured member in several professional orchestras in the greater New York area, as well as being an active chamber musician and a recognized teacher and lecturer on the secondary and college levels. In 1992 he created the Englewood Chamber Players, a community-based group of professional musicians dedicated to performing interactive and historical concerts in the communities in which they live, as well as for populations underserved by live classical performances. His diverse lecture-concerts encompass a wide range of repertoire. Current programs include a retrospective of women composers in celebration of the centennial of the 19th Amendment, a reassessment of the sonatas for violin and piano by Mozart, and a series of library lectures on the music of Beethoven in anticipation of his 250th anniversary year.

This will be the third concert in the Church's concert series for the 2019 – 2020 season. Admission, as always, is free. A short reception will follow the concert at which attendees may meet the performer. Refreshments will be served.
