## Pastor's Letter

With Lent not starting until March 9<sup>th</sup> this year, February is kind of an in-between month--after the holidays and before Lent. However, I would suggest to you that there are some important events in February that are important for you not to miss:

#### February 13th

The Session has called a meeting of the congregation for **February 13<sup>th</sup>**, immediately following morning worship, to hear and receive the 2011 church budget, discuss enlarging the Board of Deacons from six to nine members, and vote on whether or not to change the terms of the paying of the manse renovation loan at Millington Savings Bank. Also at this meeting, we will hold a review session of the sexual misconduct policy of our church. This will be just a review of the policy and will not address the larger questions of why we need to do this. The Session is asking that all church officers, staff, and anyone who works with children and youth attend this gathering. If you have attended one in the past, the Session asks that you attend again to renew your signed statement that you are familiar with the policy. If you have not attended one in the past, you must attend and not only sign the policy familiarity statement, but also fill out a release so that a limited background check can be done.

On <u>February 12<sup>th</sup></u>, we will meet for an all-day retreat with our brothers and sisters from the Kitchell Memorial Church (East Hanover) at Johnsonburg Camp and Conference Center. If you have not yet signed up, please do so ASAP so we have a good idea of numbers. You can find forms in the church narthex, Pollard Hall, and office. Those who attended last year had a marvelous time enjoying many events, the campgrounds, and each other's company.

In February, our **2011 Confirmation Class** will begin its journey to Confirmation on Pentecost Sunday, June 12<sup>th</sup>. This year's class is made up of Garrett Blakeslee with Kai Ihringer as his Sponsor, Chris DeMatteo with Tom Parziale as his Sponsor, and George Filippatos with Debra Sprague as his sponsor. The class will be meeting on Sundays after worship. They will also be attending worship services at a Jewish temple, Roman Catholic church, American Orthodox church, and possibly others. They will be conducting interviews, doing a mission project, attending Session and Presbytery meetings, and writing a 500-word Statement of Faith. There is a lot that will be happening, and I hope you will keep the confirmands, their sponsors, and me as their teacher in your prayers.

These are all big things, and I hope you will support them in whatever way you can. Let us all also pray for a little "up tick" on the temperature gauge as well.

#### 2010 Mile of Pennies Campaign

As of January 24<sup>th</sup>, we have raised **\$535.89**. Donations from January 8<sup>th</sup> - 23<sup>rd</sup> totaled **\$247.23**. That's great! Our 2010 cut-off is January 30<sup>th</sup>. Hopefully, we will receive the remaining generous donations to get us to our annual goal of **\$844.80**. That's \$308.91 more to go!

#### Kenyan Student Scholarships Costs - -

Primary Scholarships: \$50 - School is free at primary level - goes towards school supplies and uniforms. Secondary Scholarships: \$225 - School is not free - goes towards tuition, school supplies, and uniforms.

So, our Mile of Pennies (\$844.80) can provide just under four secondary scholarships, or just under 17 primary scholarships, or just over 3 secondary and 3 primary scholarships. This makes a tremendous difference in young people's lives!

It's always exciting to see children who have grown up before the congregation get to this point in their spiritual journey. Please keep the young men, their sponsors, and Rev. Peters in your prayers as they go through this process.
