Pastor's Letter

Once again, we have come to Holy Week followed by the Easter season. I say the Easter season because, in the liturgical year, Easter is not just one day, but a season that lasts until the day of Pentecost. Of course, every Sunday is also a celebration of the resurrection, because without the resurrection there is no Church. The tendency for us as humans is to enjoy the triumphal entry on Palm Sunday and then skip to Easter and forgo the events of Holy Week. Holy Week is seen as a dark and depressing time of the church year. I've been saying for years that you cannot know the joy and high of Easter until you've experienced the darkness and lows of Holy Week. Holy Week brings the Easter celebration into sharper focus for our lives.



The lesson of Holy Week is that had we been there we would have acted just like the various players of the Holy Week story. Many people have a problem with that because they don't feel they would have been the same. Many feel they would not deny Jesus like Peter did. Many feel they would not desert Jesus like all of the disciples did, and so on. We have to remember we are looking back at the story in hindsight, and we do not have the fear of the time driving us. There was fear of the Roman army, fear of the religious authorities, and fear of the mob. As humans, we all experience that fear and fatigue of spirit. This is why the words of forgiveness of Jesus from the cross are so powerful and why the resurrection is so filled with joy.

The story of Holy Week is our story and, when we realize that, we can confess and experience the joyful grace of God. I hope you will join us for our Holy Week celebrations. On Palm Sunday, April 1st, our service will start with the triumphal entry, but the focus of the service will be on the events of the rest of the week. We will celebrate Maundy Thursday with the pot-luck supper at 6:30 p.m. and then our service of communion at 7:30 p.m. This year, the Good Friday service will be held at Meyersville Presbyterian Church at 7:30 pm. Our Easter celebration will be held at 10 a.m. on Sunday, April 8th. Please join us on this important pilgrimage.

<u>New Beginnings</u>

We have had the assessment, and now we are awaiting the assessor's report and the training of our group leaders. Then, the small groups will begin a series of meetings to reflect on what new direction we believe God



is calling us to take. If we contact you and ask you to be a small group leader, please carefully consider it as we believe you have gifts that are needed to make this process work. When you are invited to become part of a small group, please know that your voice and spirit are important to the whole process, and we need you to be a part of the dialogue. This promises to be an exciting time in the life of our church, and we want you to be a part of it.

Special After-Church Meetings

As you may know, the Session has been conducting after-church Sunday meetings with members to discuss topics dealing with attracting new members and church finances. All members and friends of the church are invited to participate. We have held two meetings so far this year.

One recent suggestion was to inform people of the different purposes for which they can donate funds to the Church in addition to their regular weekly giving.

Money that the church receives through regular pledges and offerings goes into the **General Operations** account. This account supports the budget that was approved by the Session and the congregation.

There are also a number of **Dedicated Fund** accounts, which are used for specific projects or expenses. Additional money given to the church may be designated for one of the Dedicated Funds; otherwise, donated money goes into the General Account.

The Dedicated Fund accounts are:

1. Memorial Garden Fund

 \cdot The Memorial Garden is a cremation burial location for members of the church family; this fund supports the ongoing expenses of the Memorial Garden.

2. Presbytery Heating Loan Fund

 \cdot This fund consists of money that has been donated to repay the loan that was used to upgrade the church's heating system

3. Door Replacement Fund

 \cdot This fund will enable us to replace the old doors with more energy-efficient, safe, and beautiful doors.

4. Major Maintenance Fund

 \cdot The Major Maintenance Fund helps to fund major repairs. The current top priority is the replacement of the flat roof on the back of the building with a pitched roof.

5. Bell Choir

 \cdot The Bell Choir funds are used for the purchase and repair of equipment used by the Bell Choir.

6. Mission Fund

 \cdot Money that has been donated for mission projects goes into this fund.

7. Voucher Program

 \cdot Rather than donating to this account, people can easily help the church by purchasing gift cards (at face value) to do their regular shopping at Shop Rite. Gift cards are available in Pollard Hall each Sunday after church.

Another way to help is to name the church as a beneficiary in your Will. Bequests usually go into the Church Endowment; earnings from the endowment funds support mission and church maintenance on an ongoing basis.

Please remember that the church needs your financial support, especially in these tough economic times.

<u>Recipe</u>

By popular demand, following is the recipe for the delicious **Swedish Apple Pie** we enjoyed at a recent coffee hour:

Fill a 9" well-buttered pie plate 2/3 full with sliced apples Sprinkle with: 1 tsp. cinnamon and 1 tblspn. Sugar

Mix together: 1½ sticks of melted butter 1 cup sugar 1 cup flour 1 beaten egg pinch of salt (½ cup chopped nuts, if desired) Pour mixture over apples Bake at 350° for 45 minutes or until top is golden brown
