Pastor's Letter

Fire, when it is controlled, is amazing. It produces energy that can do many wonderful things. Because of this, it is very appropriate as a symbol for the Day of Pentecost. Pentecost, which we will celebrate on Sunday, May 27th, is, as many of you know, when we celebrate the beginning of the Christian Church. It is when the

disciples experienced the rush of a mighty wind and flames. The disciples, who had been hiding and waiting after the ascension of Jesus, suddenly became energized with the Spirit of Christ and left their upper room and began to preach the Good News. The movement known as *The Way* was begun.

It is appropriate to think about fire during May in our church because we will begin to do our part in discovering a new beginning for our church. Fire and energy are what we hope will happen as we begin to meet in small groups and talk about our assessment and what possibilities it portends for our church. If the process is to work for us, it will have to energize us. We, as members of the church, will have to catch the spirit of Christ in our personal lives and in our church.

On Friday and Saturday, May 11th and 12th, leaders from our church will attend a two-day program led by the national New Beginnings Team (NBT). We will see our assessment for the first time and begin to learn not only how to understand it, but also how to present it in small groups in a way that will lead to a new vision for our church. The NBT will teach us how to encourage thinking inside, and, more importantly, outside the box. The small groups are where we will begin to experience the fire as a church. It should be exciting, and when we start the small groups, I hope you will sign up to be part of one. That is the only way we can move forward.

I find it interesting that when our assessor was here and met with the congregation, he talked about the lifecycle of a church. The thing that was needed to start a church was "Energy," and when a church began to decline, the first thing to go was "Energy." So, I hope you will join us and get recharged by the flame of God's Spirit working in and through our church.

New Roof Fund

There is a new dedicated fund: <u>New Roof Fund</u>. The monies in this fund will be used to replace the flat roof with a peaked roof. Please see the following article about this project and our <u>Raise the Roof Fund Drive</u>.

Raise The Roof Update

At its March 8th meeting, the Session voted to replace the flat roof over the office portion of the building with a peaked shingle roof. Fund-raising letters will be going out to:

- congregation members
- former church members
- people in the community who have been using the church as a meeting place over the years

The Buildings and Ground committee is coordinating the project. Church blue prints and survey materials were shared with our architect of choice. We received a proposal dated March 27th from the architect. The architect, Robert Scialla, is an architect Dale Monetti has done a lot of work with. Prior to submitting the proposal, the architect reviewed the material provided and conferred with the township officials. We will be required to apply for a minor variance due to the non-conforming side and rear yard setbacks. The proposal was signed by Dale Monetti and Ed Gerecht on April 8th, and we have formally hired the architect.

The next step is the variance process. We had hoped this would not be necessary, but we are optimistic that everything will be in place to start the work early this summer
