Pastor's Letter



As we begin 2013, the big question as I am writing this seems to be, "are we going over the fiscal cliff?" It is no secret that Washington has been dysfunctional for some time. It seems that politicians today are not intent on creating better and safer lives for the people of our nation, but on creating power for themselves. There was a time when our political parties respected each other and worked together to make things happen. But now it is "my way or the highway."

I write this mindful of the fact that God calls us to live a different way. God calls us to respect all people, and this is evident in our celebration of the baptism of the Lord (January 13th). In his baptism, Jesus hears God's voice calling him *beloved*. As I have mentioned often over the years, God calls us *beloved* as well. <u>Each and every person is one of God's beloved children</u>. That statement has some far-reaching implications for us, if we choose to recognize them. If everyone is God's beloved, that means we must live our lives in ways that respect everyone's right to live a decent life or, as the Continental Congress declared in the Declaration of Independence, "the right to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness."

2012 was a difficult year in that it was filled with a lot of anger and a lot of denigration of people who thought differently. We saw this in the campaigning before the election and in the comments after the election, in the talks of the fiscal cliff, and in the shootings in Aurora, CO and Newtown, CT. If we are to survive as a nation of decent people, we have to turn this around. The way to begin is to remember our baptism. But, we must also remember that it is not just about us-- all of God's children are God's beloved. As I said on Christmas Eve, God's gift of love only becomes evident in the relationships we establish with others. God started it on that first Christmas; may we have the wisdom and the will to continue it in 2013 and beyond.

I pray that 2013 will be a year filled with blessings for all of God's children.
