Pastor's Letter

Recently, I came across the following quote by Pete Seeger that was once printed in *Rolling Stone Magazine*:

Do you know the difference between education and experience? Education is when you read the fine print; experience is what you get when you don't.

In many ways, this is so true when it comes to education about religious and spiritual matters. Many people say they can learn about God by just reading the Bible; or, by taking a walk in some beautiful part of God's creation, they can experience God. I beg to differ. The Bible is a book that was written by many different people who lived very differently than we do



now. Their cultures were very different from ours. I recall Rabbi Randy Musnitsky, of Temple Har Shalom in Warren, telling the confirmation class that Jews believe all the answers we need are found in the Torah – the first five book of the Old Testament. However, I'm sure she would add that to find those answers, we need to carefully study the scriptures.

The Bible is not a book you can just pick up and read and understand, especially if you want to understand how it relates to your life and living in a 21st-century world. Your Christian Education Committee has, for some time now, worked to include adult education programs in the life of our church. We just completed a wonderful summer series of six different programs with our friends from Meyersville and Trinity United. We want to continue that.

In September, I will be doing a sermon series on the importance of education entitled, *How To Grow In Our Relationship With God.* I will also be offering another book study this fall and asking for your suggestions as to the best time to meet. The book we will be discussing is Robin Meyers' *The Underground Church: Reclaiming the Subversive Way of Jesus.*

The Christian Education Committee comes up with program ideas; but, if you have a question or topic you would like to discuss, please let me or the committee know so that we can develop a program on that topic. The truth is, if it's something you have a question about, then it is highly probable that others have the same question.



Let's work on the fine print.

A bell tolls four times at forty-six minutes after each hour starting at 8:46 a.m. and ending at 8:46 p.m., in remembrance of the lives lost at the North Tower, at the South Tower, at the Pentagon, and in the field in Pennsylvania.

Ongoing Mission Programs

Township Food Pantry

Items can be left in baskets labeled "Food Pantry Donations" located in the Church narthex and on the table outside of Pollard Hall.

Toiletries
