Pastor's Letter

The following is from the 14th Century theologian and mystic, Meister Eckhart:

We are all meant to be mothers of God. What good is it to me if this eternal birth of the divine son takes place unceasingly but does not take place within myself? And what good is it to me if Mary is full of grace and I am not?

What good is it to me for the creator to give birth to a son if I do not also give birth to the creator in my time and in my culture?

Then, then, is the fullness of time: When the Son of God is begotten in us.

It is so easy to think that Christmas is about us. God sent God's Son for us, personally. I am not saying that God didn't send the Son for us, but God sent the son for everyone else as well – even those who don't know the story. God sent the Son for those who follow a different story.

What Eckhart does though, is remind us that Christmas, while being a blessing for us, is also a responsibility. We cannot let "God with us" be literally just about us, but we must show Christ to others. We must give birth to "The Word" in our lives for others. We must put on the garb of Christ at company and family Christmas parties. We must give birth to Christ in the life of someone who is lonely or hurting. We must give birth to Christ in the life of someone who is hungry by feeding them not just with food, but with hope and peace.

Perhaps you know someone who can use help this Advent/Christmas season. Make it your mission to give birth to Christ to them. If you do this, I would love to hear what you did.

Let's not just adore the baby in the manger; let's give birth to him in our world. Don't forget you can also invite others to the various services we will be having in our church. You will find them listed in this newsletter.



The buckets will then be sent out when they are needed to help following floods, hurricanes, tornadoes, and other disasters in the United States.

Ongoing Mission Programs

Road to Bridges

Change (and more) collected during coffee hour supports Bridges Program, providing 40 lunches per month for NJ/NY homeless.

Township Food Pantry

Items can be left in baskets labeled "Food Pantry Donations" in the Church narthex and on the table outside of Pollard Hall.

Toiletries

Full-sized and "courtesy" sized bars of soap, shampoo, and conditioner, and shower caps are donated to various causes. Place on the pew inside Pollard Hall.

Sneaker Project

Place used pairs of sneakers (any size) on the pew inside Pollard Hall. They are sent to the Somerset Food Bank and other charities.

Eyeglasses, Sunglasses, Cell Phones

Place used glasses and cell phones on the pew inside Pollard Hall.

Yarn & Fabric

Yam is used to make lap robes for wounded veterans, afghans for battered women, and hats for newborns in hospitals; any color is acceptable. Fabric (with the exception of wool and stretchables) of about 1/2 yard is used to make small bears for children, totes for wheelchair patients, etc. Place on pew inside Pollard Hall.
