Pastor's Letter

I recall when churches were told they needed to have a sexual misconduct policy. Many people in our church were aghast that the church needed a sexual misconduct policy! However, experts in the field of misconduct were adamant that churches were very susceptible to sexual misconduct for the very reason that people would not imagine that someone in a church would sexually harass or assault adults and children. History since that time has given proof that those experts were right.

With the rise of gun violence in schools and churches, as well as violent child custody disputes between parents, our church has had to take another precaution. In recent months, parents in the Long Hill Montessori School have expressed concern that the door by the mailbox is open all day when the secretary or I are in the office, and anybody can walk in undetected. They asked that we install a door intercom and electronic door lock for that door. Now, when school is in session, that door will be kept locked, and you will have to use the intercom to identify yourself. Then Paulette or I will push a button to release the door.

Since this is predominately being done for the school, they are covering half of the cost. Door locks and misconduct policies are an important way for the church to love all of God's children – both young and old and everyone in between. We want people to feel that our church is a safe place.



Another part of making the church a safe place is the purchase of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) by the Montessori school for the church. It is

placed in the entry way of the school by their door. Soon, we will be offering a course to teach people how to use the AED and also how to do CPR. The church and school staff will be taking the course, and everyone is invited to take advantage of this training. Please let me know if you are interested, and I will add your name to the list.



I look forward to working with all of you at this year's Fish and Chips dinner on the 4th. Let's have fun, and let's let people know that our church is not only a safe place, but a place where we enjoy learning about and being God's disciples in this community.

Non-Perishable Food Collection, June 5



During our annual congregational meeting in January, there was discussion regarding the upkeep of the Memorial Garden, specifically replacing the dead plants. There are currently 6 dead arborvitae trees, many original plantings from at least a decade ago. We had planned to replace them, but found out that would be too costly. We are currently reviewing an estimate for the removal and disposal of these dead trees.

As Rev. Peters mentioned previously, we now have a secure entrance to the main hallway. A buzzer system has been installed, and the door will be locked when the Montessori School is in session. Visitors must identify themselves through an intercom, and Rev. Peters or Paulette can then release the door.

Rev. Peters and Sandy Mackay have constructed new steps leading outside from the meeting room. The previous steps were long overdue for replacement. Many thanks to Rev. Peters and Sandy for their work.

We now have a **BLUE** recycling bin in the hallway outside Pollard Hall. We encourage everyone to put your recyclable cans, bottles, and plastic in the bin to help reduce our toxic footprint.

I recently took the food collection from our Communion Sunday and ongoing weekly donations to the food bank across the street at St. Vincents. The amount of food was noteworthy, and we should pat ourselves on the back for the accomplishment of this collection each month.
