Pastor's Letter

In his book, *The Heart of the Enlightened*, the late Fr. Anthony de Mello tells the following story.

After thirty years of watching television, a husband said to his wife, "Let's do something really exciting tonight." Instantly she conjured up visions of a night in town. "Great," she said. "What shall we do?" "Well," her husband said, "let's exchange chairs."

I thought of this story because, for me, it speaks a truth about the power of the Holy Spirit in our lives. During worship on May 15th, we will be celebrating Pentecost. Pentecost is the celebration of the coming of the Holy Spirit on the disciples and upon God's people, the church. We like to call it the birthday of the church because it was from this experience that the disciples went out into the world and began their ministry.

Pentecost is more than a birthday though. It is the beginning of the dynamic power of God entering the world through the believers. However, we do not often claim that power. For most of us, the coming of the Holy Spirit is just a nice thing to celebrate, but with no real power or energy. It is the exchanging of chairs. Pentecost is about power -- power that caused Peter to stand up in the temple and before the religious hierarchy and proclaim the truths of the gospel. Pentecost is about the power we can claim to fuel our own proclamation of the gospel to the world. But we have to claim it. We have to believe we have it. This is the question for our celebration: Will we be God's people filled with power, or will we just change pews? How do you answer that question?

filled with the Holv Spirit!

- ✓ Full-sized and "courtesy" sized bars of soap, shampoo, conditioner, shower caps
- ✓ Used pairs of sneakers (any size)
- ✓ Cell phones, eyeglasses, sunglasses
- ✓ Fabric: about ½ yard minimum, used to make small bears for children, totes for wheelchair patients, etc.
- ✓ Yarn: used to make lap robes for wounded veterans, afghans for battered women, and hats for newborns in hospitals
