### Pastor's Letter

Once again we descend into the holiday season. How will we fare this year? Will we arrive at the manger on Christmas Eve/Day tired and ragged, wanting to crawl into a hole and sleep for several months? Or, will we arrive at the manger with eyes glistening with expectation and hearts overflowing with wonder? We have that choice, but we need to decide now so that we can use the season of Advent to prepare ourselves.



Advent is for Christmas like the season of Lent is for Holy Week and Easter. They both give us time to prepare so we don't get there too fast and miss the true celebration. We need Advent to keep our heads on straight and focused on the reason for the season. Advent is not about the so-called war on Christmas and saying "Merry Christmas" to everyone we meet. Advent is about remembering whose birth we celebrate and why we celebrate that birth. Advent is about seeing the darkness around us and within us and realizing how much we need the good news of the birth of Emmanuel, God with us.

Our world is experiencing a very dark time right now. We can't turn on the news today without hearing a half-hour about wars, murder, mass killings; bad things happening to women, Blacks, immigrants; and, the list goes on. We need our heads on straight this Christmas. We need to experience everything that Christmas can and does mean for us.



So, I want to encourage you to observe a purposeful Advent. As most of you know, I am very much a believer in the season of Advent and its importance concerning our whole celebration of Christmas. That is the reason why we won't sing Christmas Carols in worship until the final song on the Third Sunday of Advent.

I will have a simple <u>Advent devotion guide</u> available for you to use for yourself or your family. You may pick it up after worship. Please join me in the practice of setting aside time to read scripture, reflect, and pray to God.

May God touch all of our hearts during this Advent season.

Recent highlights include the release of "Love Unspoken," a studio album of duos for violin and piano, and an appointment at New York University as staff pianist for the spring of 2018.
