



Pastor's Letter

We are now in the midst of the church season of Lent. In most people's minds, Lent is about recognizing our sins. The Christian version of the Jewish Yom Kippur and the Muslim Ramadan also recognizes the importance of confession in order to be right with God. Lent often is about doing without. People will not eat chocolate, or drink alcohol, or deprive themselves of something else they like, in order to help them focus on Lenten themes. However, Lent is not just about confession. In his Lenten devotional, *Show Me The Way*, the late Henri Nouwen writes the following:



God's mercy is greater than our sins. There is an awareness of sin that does not lead to God but to self-preoccupation. Our temptation is to be so impressed by our sins and failings and so overwhelmed by our lack of generosity that we get stuck in a paralyzing guilt. It is a guilt that says: "I am too sinful to deserve God's mercy." It is the guilt that leads to introspection instead of directing our eyes to God. It is the guilt that has become an idol and therefore a form of pride. Lent is the time to break down this idol and direct our attention to our loving Lord.

As we consider our Lenten journey, as you consider my sermon series on the different meanings of *love*, I hope you will recognize that while we are created in the image of God's love, we fall way short in living it. But the good news of Holy Week and Easter is that God's own image of love burns through our failures and restores us in God's all-embracing love. That is why we must travel through Lent and Holy Week, with its Good Friday, because only having lived through those events can we understand the great gift of love God gives us on Easter.

May your Lenten journey be filled with reflection and recognition of the wonderful grace of God. Please know there is no sin that you can confess that God cannot, or will not, forgive.
