



Pastor's Letter

Is the Book of Genesis a historical account, or is it mostly myth? In a scientific age such as ours, how do we reconcile what the book says with what science has taught us about the origins of the earth and humanity? Can something that has not happened actually share a truth?



These are questions that need to be seriously considered when reading the first book of the Hebrew Scriptures. Starting the first Thursday of July (5th), the Thursday morning Bible study will begin a discussion of the Book of Genesis. We will be using Bill Moyers book entitled, *Genesis*. A description of the book by a PBS station in Kentucky says the following:

"Bill Moyers brings together some of the world's liveliest minds for spirited discussions on the Bible's first book, incorporating contemporary issues such as racism, the role of women, dysfunctional families, and environmental responsibility into the same forum as the eternal debates about the nature of faith, the struggle between good and evil, and the path to redemption."

I hope you will consider joining us; the discussion will be lively and stimulating. The cost of the hardcover book is \$7.10; if you would like me to order one for you, please let me know ASAP. The class starts at 10:30 a.m. and ends at noon. I always have the coffee pot on. We will continue through the summer except for the weeks that I'm away (July 19, 26, Aug. 2, 30).

As this is the last newsletter until September, I want to wish you all a safe and relaxing summer. I hope you will have the time to enjoy visiting family and friends, reading a good book or two, and coming to church.

Christian Education 2018-19 Program

The Christian Education Committee is making plans for the 2018-2019 Sunday School program. We expect to have a "Nursery through Kindergarten" class which will meet weekly in the child care room. Lesson material will be provided to the leader. The room is stocked with snacks and drinks, which will be a regular part of the experience for these children. Our current plan is for a lesson to be used over the course of a month, providing the attendees with structure, repetition, and a solid message.

We also are planning for our older students, 5th & 6th graders. This group will likely meet one to two times a month, depending on the availability of the youth. We will continue the practice of working with the parents to help identify when the class can meet. We have purchased the Seasons of the Spirit, Ages 12-14 curriculum, which provides substantial direction for the leaders of the class. <u>Our Mission of the Month for June</u> was the **Bridges Outreach Lunch Program**. Our church has supported this important program for many years by providing 40 brown bag lunches each month for distribution to the homeless. Your donations will be used to purchase items needed to prepare the lunches.

Here is some information on the <u>Bridges Outreach Lunch Program</u>, provided by Jean Hoffman, who has been our coordinator for many years:

- Established in 1988 and presently housed in a former church in downtown Summit
- Has 2,000 volunteers and serves 21,000 people
- Opens their doors every Friday for the needy to take showers and receive whatever they need, i.e. food, clothing, toiletries
- In 2017, they distributed 10,000 pairs of new socks and underwear, 65,000 brown bag lunches, 7,500 toiletry kits, and tons of clothing
- Received Grants and donations from local businesses and churches, allowing them to hire a social worker
- Offers some medical services, as well as help with finding jobs and shelter
- **Our Church** provides 480 lunches per year and is now collecting seasonal men's clothing, sneakers, jackets, etc.

Thank you for your ongoing support of this very much needed program right in our own back yard!

<u>Our Mission of the Month for May</u> was the **Church World Service (CWS) Blanket Month Appeal**. We received an enthusiastic response from our congregation, and the Deacons are happy to report that we will be sending <u>\$380 to the Church World Service for the purchase of 38 warm</u> <u>woolen blankets</u> for those in need, far exceeding our initial goal of ten blankets.

Thank you again to everyone who participated in this program!

"I have been standing on the side of life, watching it float by. I want to swim in the river. I want to feel the current." So writes Mamah Borthwick Cheney in her diary as she struggles to justify her clandestine love affair with Frank Lloyd Wright. Four years earlier, in 1903, Mamah and her husband, Edwin, had commissioned the renowned architect to design a new home for them. During the construction of the house, a powerful attraction developed between Mamah and Frank, and in time the lovers, each married with children, embarked on a course that would shock Chicago society and forever change their lives. In this ambitious debut novel, fact and fiction blend together brilliantly. While scholars have largely relegated Mamah to a footnote in the life of America's greatest architect, author Nancy Horan gives full weight to their dramatic love story and illuminates Cheney's profound

influence on Wright. Elegantly written and remarkably rich in detail, <u>Loving Frank</u> is a fitting tribute to a courageous woman, a national icon, and their timeless love story.

Our next book selection is *"The Soloist: A Lost Dream, an Unlikely Friendship, and the Redemptive Power of Music,"* by Steve Lopez.

"When Steve Lopez sees Nathaniel Ayers playing his heart out on a two-string violin on Los Angeles' Skid Row, he finds it impossible to walk away. At first, he is drawn by the opportunity to crank out another column for the Los Angeles Times, just one more item on an ever-growing to-do list: "Violin Man."
