On January 17th, the American poet Mary Oliver died. In her last book of poems, *Felicity*, she has a poem entitled, *I Wake Close To Morning*:

Why do people keep asking to see

when darkness opening into morning is more than enough?

Certainly any god might turn away in disgust.

Think of Sheba approaching the kingdom of Solomon.

Do you think she had to ask,
"Is this the place?"



I thought of this poem as I thought of our season of Epiphany, which is bracketed with the words, *This is my Son.* It is a season of revelation. We continue the season of Epiphany through the month of February. It is a reminder that God is revealed to us in many different ways every day of our lives. It might be in the beauty of the sunrise or the sunset. The big super blood moon has been spectacular in the past few days.

There are events and people who touch our lives in powerful ways. We have to have eyes and ears of faith to see and hear them. They might be explainable, or not; but, they touch us with the presence of God. God's creative greatness and goodness is revealed to us and touches us every day. This February, take some time to look for revelations of God. I would even suggest that you keep a journal of "God Sightings," to help you remember them in the days, months, and years to come.




Deacons' Fund


Free Gentle Yoga Class Resumes

Due to the inclement weather on Jan. 29th, our meeting has been rescheduled to Tuesday, Feb. 5th, 7:30 p.m., in the church parlor to discuss Barbara Kingsolver's novel, *Prodigal Summer*. At that time, the next selection, *The Shoemaker's Wife*, a novel by Adriana Trigiani, will be distributed.

Inspired by the lives of her own grandparents, who came to America from northern Italy in the early 20th century, it is an old-fashioned, romantic tale of two star-tangled lovers. Beginning in the Italian Alps, the story travels by various routes to New York's Little Italy, a Hoboken factory, backstage at the Metropolitan Opera, Minnesota's Iron Range, and the trenches of France. A love story, yes, but also a paean to artisanal work, food, friendship, and family.

Road to Bridges

Change (and more) is collected during Fellowship Hour and supports the Road to Bridges program, providing 40 lunches per month to NJ/NY homeless.

Township Food Pantry

Non-perishable food items can be left in baskets labeled "Food Pantry Donations" in the Church narthex and outside Pollard Hall.

Items collected for various causes may be placed on the pew in Pollard Hall:

- ✓ Full-sized and "courtesy"-sized bars of soap, shampoo, conditioner, shower caps
- ✓ Cell phones, eyeglasses, sunglasses
- ✓ Fabric: about ½ yard minimum, to make small bears for children, totes for wheelchair patients, etc. Yarn: to make lap robes for wounded veterans, afghans for battered women, and hats for newborns in hospitals
