Pastor's Letter

Yesterday, Barbara and I went into the city to take a one-day class at Union Seminary on the Bible passages for Advent. We had planned to take Chloe so she could visit her cousin Jess (Ali's dog) at Ali's apartment. We bought a carrier for Chloe and put her in it



several times this past week and even gave her treats to make it feel better; but, she was still not liking it. We made the decision not to traumatize her in a carrier during morning rush hour on the train and subway. We decided it would be better to put her in her kitchen with her brother Jacques, and when Trevor got off work in the mid-afternoon he came over to take them out and play with them. Needless to say, it worked, and we came home to much happier dogs.

I share this with you because I see a parallel between that and our FLHiP process. We are now ready to take all the information we gleaned from the discussions and the timeline event and begin to look at the commonalities we have in our two churches and see what can be built from those. We all have our ideas of where we think it should come out, just like Barbara and I had an idea of taking Chloe to the city; but, our ideas may not be the best, and we may be led to make a different decision that will work a lot better for both churches. We have to be open to the leading of the Spirit, just as Barbara and I were open to Chloe's feelings. Right now we don't know where this process is going to end. But we have faith that it will end in a place or situation that will be better and happier for both churches.

Please know that as we continue our process we will be keeping you informed and nothing can happen without the vote of both churches, unless of course the decision is to continue as we are now. But, that will be shared with you if that is the decision. We continue to ask for your prayers for the committee and both churches as we continue this process.

Heritage Sunday, November 24th




Deacons' Fund



Township Food Pantry

- ✓ Full-sized and "courtesy"-sized bars of soap, shampoo, conditioner, shower caps
- ✓ Cell phones, eyeglasses, sunglasses
- ✓ Fabric: about ½ yard minimum, to make small bears for children, totes for wheelchair patients, etc. Yarn: to make lap robes for wounded veterans, afghans for battered women, and hats for newborns in hospitals
