Pastor's Letter

As you read this, I will be getting ready to travel to Scotland for a two week tour (Sept. 7-21). Because of this, there will be some moving back and forth with Meyersville during the month. Please look carefully at the places of worship for each week in the September Worship Services section (page 2).



This trip is one I have wanted to take for many years. I find it incredibly fascinating to visit countries that have buildings and towns older than the 243 years our country has been independent. Scotland is also the home of the Kirk of Scotland (The Church of Scotland) from which our Presbyterian denomination got its start. We celebrate this every year during our Heritage Sunday Service. I will be visiting many religious sites on the trip. In Edinburgh, I will see places associated with John Knox, who is credited with the development of Presbyterianism in Scotland, and I will visit the Holy Island of Lindisfarne.



Lindisfarne was founded by St. Aidan, an Irish monk, who came from Iona, the center of Christianity in Scotland. St. Aidan converted Northumbria to Christianity at the invitation of its king, Oswald. St. Aidan founded Lindisfarne Monastery on Holy Island in 635, becoming its first Abbot and Bishop. The Lindisfarne Gospels, a 7th century illuminated Latin manuscript written here, is now in the British Museum.

Towards the end of my tour, I will visit the Island of Iona that the monk Columba came to from Ireland, bringing Christianity to Scotland. There is a wonderful Christian ministry there to this day.

I will also be visiting pre-Christian sites such as the Ring of Brodgar in the Orkney Islands on the coast of the North Sea at the top of Scotland. Of course I cannot go to Scotland and not visit our namesake, the town of Stirling and Stirling Castle.

Sometime this fall, I will do a brunch program on my visit to Scotland and look forward to sharing my pictures, experiences, and learnings from my trip. I will also have an itinerary of my trip up at the church while I am gone so you can see where I am or where I have been.

I will be back in the pulpit on Sunday, Sept. 22. I hope you will enjoy having my wife, Barbara, preaching on Sunday, Sept. 15th, and the added bonus is that Alison will be the liturgist for that service!




to collect non-perishable food in the baskets located in the church entry-ways during the rest of the month.

Ed Gerecht has put together instructions for preparing the coffee makers; the instructions will also be posted in the kitchen:



Instructions for Preparing Coffee Makers

- 1. Insert a filter, cone or flat, into the machine.
- 2. Fill machine with water, as full as possible. You can go slightly above the marked "Full" line.
- 3. Put about SIX scoops of coffee into machine, regular or decaf; coffee should fill about ¼ of filter.
- 4. Place a flat filter on top of the coffee. This prevents grounds from splashing into the water.
- 5. Start machine brewing at least one hour before the end of the service.


