Message from Rev. Aspinall

Dear First Presbyterian Friends,

As most of you know by now, your Session has asked me to be the Interim Pastor of your church starting on February 1 after Rev. Peters retires at the end of January. This new position will be half-time. I will be leading worship; meeting with the Session, Deacons, and other committees; providing pastoral care; and, helping the church to take steps forward in the process of figuring out where God is leading your congregation in the future. The Presbytery will be providing considerable help in that last task which usually takes about a year or a year and a half.



I will also continue to be the part-time pastor of Meyersville Presbyterian Church. For the moment, while COVID restricts our gathering in person and the weather is a bit cold for outdoor worship services, we will continue to share online worship services. When the weather is warmer, we may add outdoor services. Whether these outdoor services will be with the two churches together or separately at different times, remains to be decided. As it becomes possible to gather indoors for worship, we will again talk about how worship can happen in both sanctuaries.

It is important for everyone at both FPC and MPC to understand that my serving both churches is in no way meant to short-circuit the processes each church must go through in envisioning and planning for their futures. Our Future of Long Hill Presbyterians (FLHiP) discussions have been side-lined by COVID and I hope that they can resume at some point. But, they are only one part of the larger questions each church is facing. Each church must discover the ministry to which God is calling it. FPC will have the benefit of a structured interim process meant to help discern that ministry.

I feel I have gotten to know many of you over the years of shared summer worship services, educational programs, and Vacation Bible School, and I am looking forward to deepening and broadening those relationships as we work together in ministry for the next period in your church's story.

After we finalized the job description for Interim Minister, we anticipated beginning the search. Shortly after submitting the position description and the terms of call, Presbytery advised us that Rev. Barbara Aspinall was willing and they were agreeable to her becoming our Interim Minister. The members of the committee are grateful for Rev. Aspinall's guidance during the time of Rev. Peters' illness, her willingness to serve as our Interim Minister, and her support for all of our activities.

At the January Session meeting, Rev. Aspinall was approved as our Interim Minister. We all look forward to having her guide our Church through the coming months.

Join the Online Zoom Coffee Hour**- Janet Parziale**

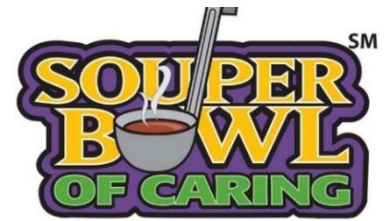

Know Someone Who Needs a Card?

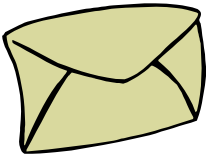

Worship Committee**- Janet Parziale****Shared Services with Meyersville Presbyterian Church**

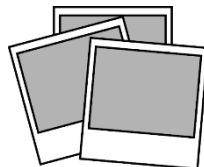

Ash Wednesday, February 17th**Your Pictures Wanted!**

This year, Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, will be on February 17th. The Worship Committee is preparing an online Ash Wednesday worship service to be shared that day. Because it will be online, we will not be using the Liturgy of the Ashes. The focus of traditional Ash Wednesday services is the brevity of life, that we came from dust and will soon enough return to the earth, dust once more. Considering the year we have all just been through, I think this is something we are all very well aware of. I am not sure we need too much reminding of this truth.

Another way of thinking about this is that the brevity and uncertainty of life makes this life we have even more precious, inviting us to praise, wonder, and seize the moment. This is the day and let us rejoice in it! What we love is mortal and transitory but, instead of grieving that this year, let's celebrate the things in this world, the people we love, that remind us of the presence of God and God's everlasting love for us. Like Jacob after a night of wrestling with an angel, Ash Wednesday causes us to pause, notice, wake up, and discover that "God is in this place" and now we know it!

In view of this different perspective on Ash Wednesday, one component of this year's recorded online Ash Wednesday service will be a celebration of the people, circumstances, places, and times that have reminded us that "God is in this place." 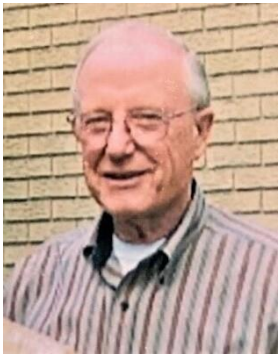
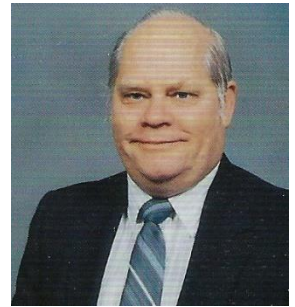
When we receive an address for a family member of Lew Addison, we will pass it on to you.
