Pastor's Message

Dear Church Family,

Promises, promises. Broken, unfulfilled promises can be hurtful –



whether it is promises made by political candidates, friends, or family members. Broken promises damage both our trust in others and our own ability to judge whether or not to trust others. We want to believe; we want to trust, but broken promises bring disappointment, sadness, frustration, and even heartbreak. Sometimes those feelings are related to another's promise and sometimes to our own broken promises.

We are still in the season of Eastertide, still celebrating God's triumph in the resurrection of Jesus Christ. This was God's promise unbroken, God's promise fulfilled. There are empty promises all around us, but the resurrection is not one of them. God has staked everything – God's love, the Incarnation, God's commitment to us – on the fulfillment of this promise. Even if others don't come through for us, even if we don't come through for ourselves or for others, God's promise is real and unbroken.

And this, of course, is very Good News. It means our present and our future is assured and secured. But what difference does knowing this make in our lives now? How does it change our present, how we live our lives? How does it affect our own promises?

As Christians in this world, as people who trust in God's resurrection promise, and as part of the church, Christ's body in the world, we are called to embody God's promise in a world of broken promises. Our lives bear witness to God's promise kept even if our experience is of human promises broken. Christ's resurrection changes things for us. It gives us knowledge and experience of a promise kept and we can therefore make and keep promises to others and be less devastated by promises broken by others. Christ's resurrection makes all the difference.



On May 23rd, we celebrate the arrival of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, when we received the power and the inspiration that enables us to carry that difference into the world.


Weekly Contributions

Worship Schedule

At a joint meeting of the Sessions of First Presbyterian Church and Meyersville Presbyterian Church on April 22, an arrangement was approved for worship services in the upcoming months.

First, **online services will continue each week**. The link to the service will be emailed and posted on our website. This email will generally be sent on the Saturday before the Sunday of the service.



Second, when the weather permits, there will be an additional outdoor in-person worship service. Notice of whether or not there will be an outdoor service will be included in the Saturday emails.

And finally, where the outdoor in-person services take place (weather permitting) will be according to the following schedule:

May 2nd will be a communion service at Meyersville at 10 a.m. All the other Sundays in May (9, 16, 23, 30) will be at Stirling at 10 a.m. All Sundays in June will be at Meyersville at 10 a.m.

Mission of the Month - May & June

The Deacons are once again working with the Church World Service (CWS) and their "Blanket Month Appeal" for our May and June "Mission of the Month" donations. In 2020, CWS delivered 17,000 blankets to people in need in the US and another 1,000 to folks in the Caribbean who were struck by hurricanes and flooding.

The **blankets cost \$10 each** and have been used in many ways – including to help families who have been driven from their homes due to hurricanes, tornados, or other disasters; to keep the homeless warm; to carry personal belongings; to cover a window broken in a storm to keep the cold air out; a privacy divider in an overcrowded refugee facility; and, as a tent or ground covering. As people who trust in the promises of God, we reach out to comfort those who are struggling, who are in crisis, who need our prayers, our support, and our comfort. The gift of

a blanket reminds those who are suffering that God loves them, and that God's people care. From the time we were babies, a warm blanket has meant comfort and love.

We will be collecting during both May and June. Please send your donation to the church office or directly to Elsie **Turqman, and mark the memo "CWS Blanket" or "Mission of the Month."** Remember to include your name and/or your envelope number if you would like your donation to be recorded. Thank you in advance for supporting this special mission program.

Flowers for Our Sanctuary

Rev. Aspinall will continue recording alternately at both churches. If you would like to have flowers placed on the chancel for services that are recorded at Stirling, please call the church office or Israel Sierra.

During May, services will be recorded at Stirling for Sundays, May 9th (Mother's Day) and 23rd. During June, services will be recorded at Stirling for Sundays, June 6th and 20th (Father's Day).

You may leave a message at the church with the specifics (your name, which Sunday service you would like them for, and who they are given in memory/honor of).

<u>Since recordings are done on Thursdays</u>, the flowers need to be picked up by Israel on Wednesdays. Please <u>place your</u> <u>order at least one week prior to the Wednesday pick-up date</u> to allow enough lead time to have them for the service you choose. The cost is still \$30; your check (made payable to: *Flowers on the Ridge*) can be sent to the church office. If you have any questions, please contact Janet Parziale.



<u>Helping Out</u>








Meyersville Book Club

Vivid and compelling in its portrait of one woman's struggle for fulfillment in a society pivoting between the traditional and the modern, <u>The Henna Artist</u> opens a door into a world that is at once lush and fascinating, stark and cruel.

Escaping from an abusive marriage, seventeen-year-old Lakshmi makes her way alone to the vibrant 1950s pink city of Jaipur. There she becomes the most highly requested henna artist and confidante—to the wealthy women of the upper class. But trusted with the secrets of the wealthy, she can never reveal her own...

Known for her original designs and sage advice, Lakshmi must tread carefully to avoid the jealous gossips who could ruin her reputation and her livelihood. As she pursues her dream of an independent life, she is startled one day when she is confronted by her husband, who has

tracked her down these many years later with a high-spirited young girl in tow—a sister Lakshmi never knew she had. Suddenly the caution that she has carefully cultivated as protection is threatened. Still, she perseveres, applying her talents and lifting up those that surround her as she does.
