Pastor's Note

These 4 weeks before Christmas, in the season we call Advent, I'll be thinking about hospitality. Hospitality refers to the generous and friendly treatment of visitors and guests. It is a joy to experience when someone has the gifts of hospitality. There are so many details that a host pays attention to and steps that are taken in preparation to ready a space or a meal to truly make a visitor feel welcomed. It is a skill (and an art) which comes natural to some and to some others it is hard work to be welcoming. Either way, the effort and the intention, pays off as relationships and connection are nurtured and solidified through hospitality.

As we think about how God welcomes us, we will prepare ourselves to welcome him.


However you prepare to welcome Christ into your world, I pray you do so with joyous expectation!




Advent Devotions

We will light the Advent candle of **Joy**. We hope to hear from our bell choir, who is doing their best to be ready to offer their "joyful noise".

Blue Christmas Service

A Blue Christmas Service will be held on December 17th at 3:00 pm at the First Presbyterian Church of Stirling.

For many, Christmas is not 'The Most Wonderful Time of the Year' (as the song goes). Some people experience depression in the darkening days of winter or others are grieving the loss of loved ones. A Blue Christmas service can offer some healing and hope.

Advent 4 and Christmas Eve

10:00 am—The morning service will be held at the First Presbyterian Church of Stirling. We will light the fourth candle of Advent for the Love of God born to us. We will sing beautiful carols of the season as we also experience the story of Christ's birth through a simple pageant.

7:30 pm —The evening service will be held at Meyersville Presbyterian Church. This will be a service of lessons and carols. We will light the Christ candle and sing Silent Night.

Both Sessions have discussed that our two congregations find it meaningful to have Advent and Christmas Eve services in their own individual sanctuaries. This year the fourth Sunday of Advent is also Christmas Eve. We will hold a service at The First Presbyterian Church of Stirling on Dec 24th at 10 am. The evening Christmas Eve service will take place at Meyersville this year at 7:30 pm. We will adjust our worship calendar so that next year Advent and Christmas Eve services will be at the First Presbyterian Church of Stirling. This will be accomplished by holding services at Meyersville again in January 2024.
