Saturdays are personal days-- but I'm more flexible when it comes to working (after all, chores can wait, right?). Trusting in the goodness and grace of God, I enthusiastically look forward to the important and meaningful ministry we will share.

Our Church Missions

Mission of the Month: June

Our Joint-Church Mission Committee has chosen **Village 2 Village as the Mission of the Month for June.** Village2Village supports vulnerable children through education, medical care, nutrition, and social and spiritual mentoring. It builds relationships with children and families one at a time, seeing them as individuals with untapped potential to change their communities.

Village2Village began in 2003 with only \$100 to help nine school-aged children in Uganda who lived with elderly and sick grandparents or no adults at all. This \$100 bought one bag of rice and beans, nine school uniforms, and nine backpacks. It has grown to serve 200+, many with special needs including HIV/AIDS. With God's help and support from congregations like ours, it has become a staffed organization, recognized by Uganda as non-governmental organization (NGO) since 2006. After many years of fiscal sponsorship by First Baptist Church of Bristol, Vermont,

Village2Village Project became a separate 501c3 charitable organization at the end of 2016. They now have partners in 40 countries, reaching out from their "villages" into rural Africa to serve some of the world's most desperate children. Village2Village Project has growing University and vocational programs, and their first students are graduating and beginning to give back to their community. Their goal is always to meet the individual needs of each child so they can reach their potential and change their world. They continue to grow because the need is so desperate. We continue to provide 40 bag lunches to the Bridges Outreach organization for distribution to the homeless in Newark, Irvington, and NYC. The sandwiches, drinks, and non-perishable goodies are delivered to Summit monthly in brown lunch bags. The children from the Long Hill Montessori School often decorate the lunch bags. Twelve Baskets Food Pantry - Moving to FPC-Stirling in June

Our local Food Pantry, Twelve Baskets, currently housed at All Saints' Church in Millington, will be moving to FPC-Stirling for the months of July, August, and September again this year. Jointly sponsored by FPC-Stirling, Meyersville, All Saints', and LHT CERT, the food pantry has been serving guests two Saturday mornings per month. Shelf stable food as well as meat, dairy products, eggs, and fresh produce are available for food insecure families in our area.

Some of the food will be stored at FPC-Stirling, and guests will come there on the scheduled Saturday mornings. Volunteer help is needed to set up the tables and put out the food in Pollard Hall as well as serve guests on the days the pantry is open. Help is also needed in picking up food from the distribution center in Hillside. For several years, both of our churches have been selling ShopRite gift cards (known as the *Voucher Program*). For every \$100 sold, the church earns \$5; that is, we get 5% of all sales. Over the course of a year, that can add up to a significant addition to our church budget. Everyone buys food and other necessities. Why not use the gift cards



for that purpose and help the church at the same time? The gift cards come in \$20, \$50, and \$100 denominations. They never expire; you can continue to use them until the balance is \$0.
