Pastor's Note

"Worrying doesn't take away tomorrow's troubles. It takes away today's peace."

I don't know who wrote or said the above quote, but I think it is very true. Unfortunately these pithy sayings don't often give us an alternative to worrying. This is why I love Jesus's advice in Matthew 26. Jesus says do not worry about life. But then he gives a very clear direction for what we ARE supposed to do: open our eyes and look around, look at the birds, look at the flowers in the fields, look and see how God provides! As I write this last line, I take a deep breath and I look out the window of my office. At Meyersville my view includes a beautiful garden and tall autumn trees. In Stirling, my view literally is of the memorial garden where so many lovely souls are remembered. As I open my eyes and heart, I recognize the ways God's generous care is reflected in all I see. I know God has been faithful. I know God provides.

Because God provides generously to us, we don't need to worry. Instead we are called to "strive first for the kingdom of God." God provides, as Jesus promises in this verse, and then we are invited to give thanks and share generously out of that provision.

There is much for which we can all give thanks. Worry needs to be put in perspective. As followers of a generous God, we are called to respond to God's faithfulness. This is what a church community is all about– every Sunday we celebrate God's generosity, we acknowledge God's goodness and we pledge to give back in praise, prayer and service.

Both our congregations' Sessions will be sending out Stewardship letters in November. What rich histories both churches have to be grateful for and celebrate. And what hopeful futures we all must also be ready to work towards. Please respond generously in thanksgiving and in faith.

On June 19th, 1873, 24 people signed a pledge to become members of a Presbyterian Church at Stirling, NJ, as soon as it can be in due form organized, under the care of the Presbytery of Morris and Orange. This pledge, met the approval of the Morris and Orange Church Executive Committee. The Committee then met at Stirling on July 9th, **1873**, at two o'clock P.M., to organize the Presbyterian church. Nineteen letters were presented. The letters were accepted and the church consisting of nineteen members was duly organized.
