### **NOTE FROM THE PASTOR**

In English, the word "love" is over used. When we speak of love we mean our feelings toward our spouse, our parents or even a cup of coffee.

The ancient Greek used in the New Testament has a number of words for love. Phillia ( $\phi\iota\lambda\iota\alpha$ ), refers to feelings one has towards friends. Yes, the "brotherly love" referenced in Philadelphia. This word was used in the New Testament to describe Jesus' love for his disciples (John 20:2) and for Lazarus (John 11:3). There is Storge ( $\sigma\tau op\gamma$ ). This Greek word refers to love we have for members of our family. The most common word for love used in the New Testament is Agape ( $\dot{\alpha}\gamma\dot{\alpha}\pi\eta$ ). Agape was frequently used to reference a distinctive love: the unconditional and self-sacrificing love of God and the kind of love which we should reciprocate and emulate.

This month Ash Wednesday is on Valentine's Day, February 14th. This initially felt very odd to me. But upon further reflection, I think this confluence has a lesson for us. Valentine's Day sells love short. The "only" love Valentine's Day celebrates is romantic love. Romantic love can be wonderful— no doubt. But its not all there is. At its heart Valentine's day is truly only about the sales of chocolate, cards and flowers (pun intended). On this day love is narrowed and commodified, it becomes a too sweet, too shallow version of love.

On Ash Wednesday we remember a love which never ends— that cannot be stopped even by death itself. We remember our mortality on Ash Wednesday. We acknowledge that we have not always loved our Creator as we should— we place ashes on our foreheads to show we know the fragility of our life and that we are sorry for our sins. We start the journey toward Easter this way, humbly, so that we are ready to hear again, and experience anew, the greatest love story of all time— the love born and reborn in Christ — offered to us unconditionally.

Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable; it keeps no record of wrongs; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends.

May God fill your heart with love this month,

#### Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on Wednesday, February 14 2024.

The season of Lent is a time of prayer, fasting and self-examination in preparation for the celebration of the resurrection of the Lord at Easter. Easter is Sunday, March 31st this year. Lent is a period of **40 days** — like the flood of Genesis, Moses' sojourn at Mount Sinai, Elijah's journey to Mount Horeb, Jonah's call to Ninevah to repent and Jesus' time of testing in the wilderness. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday. It is a day of mourning for our sin and the sin of all humanity before God. On this day, and in Ash Wednesday services, we recognize our mortality and the grace of God which is offered to us so that we need not fear death. Non-Catholic Christians have in recent years embraced the tradition of the imposition of ashes. Ashes are a biblical symbol of death, repentance, mourning and sacrifice. On this day, we thank the Lord for creating us and we pray that God breathe new life into our burned-out, dusty lives once more. On our Lenten journey, we prepare to be remade once again in the Rising of Christ.



## **LENT 2024**

#### Lenten Sermon Series "Less Can Be More: Sermon Series on Fasting"

The 40 days before Easter are often a time when people "give something up" for Lent. No chocolate, no meat, no swearing... This is a version of Lenten fasting. And many people may choose to fast, even just from red meat, without really understanding why.

This Lent I would like to share some history around Biblical fasting, explore the benefits of spiritual disciples in our faith life, and consider what thought patterns and actions we might "Pause" in order to make space in our life for a deeper, fuller relationship with God. What is the fast which God asks of us? Not to starve our soul, but fill ourselves and the world with the goodness of God.

The Gospels are full of stories of Jesus sharing meals with disciples, friends, even tax collectors and Pharisees. ### **Bridges Outreach Lunch Program**

This January, we began FPCS's 17th year of making lunches for the homeless through Bridges Outreach, located in Summit, New Jersey. As was noted in the FPCS's Annual Report, it is wonderful to be back again making lunches together with members of both churches. Our January 23rd date found Sue Hahn and Janet Parziale making 40 peanut butter and jelly sandwiches while Gail Duffe, Tom Parziale, and Tommy DiBartolo (pictured at the right) filled the brown bags with lots of good things, including water bottles, applesauce, and a delicious snack. The lunches were then taken to the Bridges Outreach office in Summit where they will be distributed to many grateful members of the homeless community in Summit, Newark, Irvington, and even New York City. As usual, the folks at the Bridges office were extremely thankful for our contributions.

This year we are again committing to provide monthly lunches throughout 2024. This program has been a huge success because of the dedicated help provided by members of both churches.

The cost of providing the 40 lunches is approximately \$90 each month, \$2.25 per lunch. We

accept donations of snacks, fruit cups or applesauce, and drinks throughout the year. If you are able to help with this, please drop your donations off at FPCS and mark it "Bridges Lunches." All monetary donations will be used to purchase the items that go into the lunch bags and will help us to continue this worthy program.

Our next lunch-making date is Tuesday, February 20th in Pollard Hall. If you have an hour's time and would like to help, we would love to have you join us. Thank you.

## THE 2024 PER CAPITA

Every year, every member of every Presbyterian Church (USA) is asked to pay "per capita". This annual payment is how local churches support the ministry of The Presbyterian Church (USA) denomination.

The total per capita in 2024 is \$42.50 per member.

Please pay this separately from your yearly pledge– marking your check or envelope with Per Capita. We are required to make a payment to the Presbytery based on the number of people on our membership role.

Of this total, \$28.55 is used by our local Presbytery. The remainder is sent, as required, to the regional Synod, \$4.10, and national General Assembly, \$9.85.
