## NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Symbols can be helpful tools in our faith-life. They are visual reminders of important realities. The cross has become a universal symbol of Christianity. During Maundy Thursday and Good Friday of Holy Week, Christians everywhere will recall the reality of Jesus's death on a cross.

Crucifixion was an ancient method of execution. It was practiced in the Roman Empire and neighboring Mediterranean cultures at the time Jesus lived. A person was tied or nailed to a large wooden stake with a cross beam. The purpose of crucifixion was to provide a gruesome public way to execute criminals and dissenters so that the masses would be dissuaded from challenging laws and the authority of the empire. Dying on a cross was simply humiliating and horrific. And this is what we have as the focal point in both our church sanctuaries???

Presbyterians, like many other Protestant denominations, however generally use a **plain** cross in our worship and spiritual practices. For the power of the symbol for Protestant Christians lies in the **emptiness** of that brutal device. Christ could not be held by violence and fear of those who accused him — love overcame hate, life had victory over death!

The shape of a tool of hurt and hate has been reclaimed and reimagined as a symbol of love and life- reminding us that nothing can separate us from the love of God through Christ our Lord! As you go through he season of Lent this March, coming ever closer to the promise and hope of Easter, when you see a cross may it remind you of God's power working to defeat all that is evil and violent in this world.

I wonder what other symbols speak to your heart and soul and remind you of God's transformative love? A simple rock can remind you of the boulder which was rolled away from the empty tomb and of God's daily gift to you of life. The spring flowers we share at Easter time too are symbols of life which burst forth after the cold and darkness of winter. This Lent and Easter I pray that you will look and see in symbols, and in your life, the power of God's unstoppable goodness and love!

## **Holy Week**



#### Sunday, March 24th begins Holy Week and is Palm Sunday. Scripture text is Mark 11:1-11.

We recall Jesus's entry into the city of Jerusalem. He was met by crowds who had come to mark Passover. They people welcomed him by shouting Hosanna and waving palm branches. We too will shout Hosanna and have palm branches in worship.

## Thursday, March 28th is Maundy Thursday.

Scripture text is John 13:1-17, 31b-35.

Come, join us as we recall the Last Supper with a Covered Dish Dinner on Maundy Thursday, March 28<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm followed by a service of Communion at the First Presbyterian Church of Stirling.

The word "Maundy" originated from the Latin word called "mandatum," which means "commandment." This day is named after Jesus's commandment to his disciples to love one another. Maundy Thursday demonstrates the importance of humility and service by remembering Jesus washing the feet of his disciples.

If you would like to attend this special dinner, please sign up on the Signup Sheet currently in Stirling's Pollard Hall or during March in Fellowship Hall at Meyersville. When you sign up, please note whether you can bring a salad, vegetable, main dish, or dessert. The Worship Committee will provide bread, butter, and beverages. We hope to see you there!

### Friday, March 29th is Good Friday.

An Easter Vigil will be kept from 10 am to 4pm in the Meyersville sanctuary.

Members of both churches are welcome to sit vigil. <u>You can sign up for ½ hour times from 10 a.m.-4 p.m.</u> There will be devotions and information available for you to use in your prayers. You can read, pray, or sit in quiet reflection during your time. There will be no one else in the sanctuary during your time. It is a way to reflect on what the crucifixion and death of Jesus means for you and for the church.

### **Good Friday Tenebrae Service**

The Good Friday Tenebrae Service at 6:30pm will be held at Meyersville Presbyterian Church. Tenebrae is Latin for "darkness" or "shadows". We will recall the events which led to Jesus's death on the cross and listen to the last words Jesus spoke. As we do we will extinguish candles. The service ends in near darkness. Please come to this meaningful experiential service.

## **Resurrection Sunday, March 31st**



On Easter there will be a brief early morning service at 7:00 a.m. at Hillview Farm in Meyersville. Wear old comfortable shoes as the walk up to the orchard can be a little muddy. Dress for the weather.

Then, at 10:00 a.m., we will have our Easter service in the sanctuary in

Stirling. We hope you will join us for this celebration as we recall the good news that He has risen. The church will be decorated with the Easter flowers/plants that people have ordered.
